1. Introduction

The Pioneer Churches on the Prairies is an ongoing initiative to record, document and share information about the historic churches established by early settlers in northeastern Alberta. The earliest immigrants arrived in the late 1890s, and continued to settle for decades afterwards. Due to declining rural populations, fewer members, and increasing costs, many of these parishes are closing. Time is running out to capture and preserve the memories of these historic churches that played such an important role in the lives of our ancestors.

The long-term project objectives are to:

- 1. Capture, record and preserve high-quality, high-dynamic-range (HDR) photographs and videos of these historic churches and their cemeteries. This is being done using the advanced technology of DJI drones and a Nikon camera. All images are shot in RAW for best quality and ease of processing. For each photo, the drones and cameras record data such as GPS location, date, time, camera settings etc.
- Research, record and preserve available historical information about each parish and its cemetery. In addition to providing photographs and videos of cemeteries, we are collaborating with <u>https://findagrave.com</u> to post our photos on their website. We also provide a link to the cemetery listed on *Find a Grave* website for data about the people that are buried there.
- 3. Find, digitize and share music and other audio relevant to this project. We have developed a sophisticated process to digitize and re-master old recordings of sacred, festive, and traditional Ukrainian music. The sacred music is being used as a background for each of the church videos.
- 4. Share, promote and inform the general public and our members about these important historic churches. This is being done by a dedicated website <u>https://pioneerchurches.ca</u> that has extensive photographs, videos, histories, cemetery information and a music library. We have also produced several dozen museum-quality canvas photographs of the churches. High-quality smaller photographs and church cards have been printed and are being offered to various organizations, parishes and individuals.
- 5. Ensure that this history of our pioneer churches is not forgotten, and will continue to be available for future generations. ALL of the resources developed by this project, including all of the images (original and edited), videos, histories and music are being made freely available, and without any restrictions, to sustainable organizations/institutions to preserve and share them in the future. Discussions are continuing with various non-profit, religious, university and government organizations.



2. Project Components

2.1 Website

The Pioneer Churches on the Prairies is the primary method for recording and sharing the images and histories of these historic churches. The website consists of the following components:

- Welcome page with a bulletin board and subscription form for our mailing list.
- A page for each church consisting of: (for a total of 92 churches)
 - A video or photograph of that church (85 videos)
 - A short (or longer) history of the parish
 - Photographs of the cemetery (if applicable)
 - Link to the cemetery page on the *Findagrave.com* website
 - o Audio recordings of the appropriate Memory Eternal chant
 - \circ $\;$ Live GPS links to Google maps for the church and cemetery locations
 - \circ $\;$ The affiliation of the church (UOC, UCC, OCA, RGO, Other).
- Photo galleries for each church and its cemetery categorized by denomination (3,000+ photos).
- Some general video church tours (9 videos).
- A Music Library consisting of digitized sacred (23 albums), festive (8 albums), traditional Ukrainian music (22 albums) and Ukrainian bands (29 albums).
- Resources section containing: a) articles on parish security, disaster planning and more;
 b) clergy lists and contact information; c) links to other related websites and resources;
 and d) credits including audio recordings of music used for the videos.
- Contact form for inquires, comments and suggestions.
- Sections on About Us, Our Purpose, Terms of Use, Technology Tools and a link to our videos on Vimeo.

2.2 Canvas prints

Because the digital images are taken in high-resolution and high-dynamic-range (HDR), the printed photographs show exceptional detail and exhibit very vibrant colors. We print many of the historic church photographs on large (24 x 36 inch) and medium (16 x24 inch) format canvas prints.

Once the canvas prints are received, they are further enhanced by adding a black foam core back. The prints are then treated with 2 to 3 coats of archival preservative that should extend their lifetime to about 200 years.

A label indicating the name of the church, when it was founded, the date the photograph was taken, the name of the photographer, and the GPS co-ordinates of its location, is affixed to the back of the print.

These photographs are used in our exhibits; are donated to clergy and museums; and sold to interested individuals.




2.3 Photographs

Not everyone wants, or has room for, the large canvas prints. Therefore, we print 8.5 x 11-inch photographs of many of the historic churches on vinyl photographic paper. These are attached to 9 x 12-inch black foam core board. A label with all of the same information as the canvas prints, is affixed to the back. These are packaged in a clear envelope for further protection.

In addition to individual photos, these images are also used to created poster boards with six photographs. Usually, posters contain churches from the same denomination. (*See poster below*).

These individual photos and the poster boards are used in our exhibits; are donated to parishes and museum gift shops; and sold to the public.






2.4 Cards

The *Pioneer Churches* photos are used to create individual cards of the various churches. These cards contain a high-quality photograph of the church on the front, and the appropriate information on the back.

3. New Churches Photographed

Some fifteen (15) historic churches were photographed in 2023. All of these were added to the *Pioneer Churches* website. Videos were created for all of these churches (except for *Holy Ascension* in Smoky Lake) and posted on the website, along with their histories and links to their cemeteries. Some 20 to 50 photographs of each church were posted in their respective Photo Galleries.

The following eleven *Ukrainian Orthodox* churches were added in this phase of the project:

- Slawa (South) Holy Assumption of St. Mary Ukrainian Orthodox Church
- Smoky Lake Holy Ascension Ukrainian Orthodox Church
- Szypenitz St. Mary Ukrainian Orthodox Church

The following two Ukrainian Catholic Churches were added:

- Myrnam Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Ukrainian Catholic Church
- Smoky Lake (North) St. Paraskevia Ukrainian Catholic Church



The following two OCA churches were added:

• North Bank – Holy Transfiguration Orthodox Church

• Pakan – St. Elias Orthodox Church (see photo on left)

5. Marketing and Promotion

he following activities and events were undertaken to make stakeholders, interested parties, and the general public aware of the *Pioneer Churches* project, website, exhibits, photographs and cards.

- Ads Purchased two quarter-page ads for one year about *Pioneer Churches* in *Promin* Magazine.
- Articles Wrote and published two articles in Promin Magazine regarding our Music Library.
- **Canadian Orthodox History Project** This website has parish-submitted listings, descriptions and histories of Orthodox Churches in Canada. We noticed that some of our *Pioneer Churches* photos have been added to several of the parishes on that website.
- **Cards** Provided packages of cards to Metropolitan Ilarion (UOCC), Bishop David (Ukrainian Catholic Eparchy of Edmonton), Basilian Brothers Museum in Mundare, Alberta and several clergy serving in rural areas.
- **Donations** Cards, photos and canvas prints were donated to St. John's Cathedral for their 100th Anniversary celebration and for their fundraising and to St. Mary Romanian Orthodox Church to raise funds to rebuild their church that burned in June 2023.
- Find a Grave website The Findagrave.com website is a comprehensive world-wide database of cemeteries. This website has information and burial lists for all of the parishes on the Pioneer Churches website. We have links to Findagrave.com. We also contribute 3 to 4 of our church/cemetery photos to each of their cemetery listings.
- Flyers Prepared a one page-flyer on the Pioneer Churches project. These have been posted and are available at St. Anthony's Parish, St. John's Parish, and Ukrainian Museum of Canada (Alberta Branch). Flyers are also available at the Western Eparchy AGM meetings and at all of our exhibits.
- Links The following websites have links to our *PioneerChurches.ca* website: Alberta Family Histories Society, various Facebook pages, County of Lamont, Storyphile, Ukrainian Canadian Genealogy, Ukrainian Museum of Canada (Alberta Branch), and Ukrainian Musicians Association.
- **Logo** We held an international contest to create a logo for out *Pioneer Churches* on the Prairies project and components. Out of the 450 entries, we selected one that was based on our photograph of Saint John's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Egremont Alberta.
- Mailouts We recently sent out a short update on the *Pioneer Churches* project to two lists. The first was to the *Alberta Museums Association* members list (approximately 1,000). The second mailing was to our own compiled mailing list of about 130 individuals. These included clergy, members from various parishes, artists, photographers, government officials and selected museums.



- **Memberships** We are paid-up members of *Alberta Museums Association* (AMA), *Alberta Council for the Ukrainian Arts* (ACUA) and the *Drone Pilots Association of Canada* (DPAC).
- Merchandise Cards, photos and canvas prints are available to purchase at *St. Anthony's Parish Gift Shop*, the *Ukrainian Museum of Canada* (Alberta Branch), and *the Romanian Orthodox Parish at Boian* (for fundraising to replace their church that burned on June 6, 2023). These are also directly available from Steppingstones / Pioneer Churches.
- **Vimeo** All the videos are hosted on our account with Vimeo (similar to YouTube, but NO ads). The videos are public, thereby allowing anyone to view our collection of historic church videos.

Website – Our most powerful and successful marketing and promotion tool is our website and its growing number of visitors. In 2023, the *Pioneer Churches* website had approximately 10,000 unique visitors, 15,000 visits with 221,000 pages viewed.

The traffic stats for the first four months of 2024 (Jan. 1 to April 30) are: 8,400 unique visitors, 18,050 visits and 83,700 viewed pages.

A Google search for "pioneer churches" has our website in the first top 3 positions out of 9.5 million results. A search for any of the parishes listed on the *Pioneer Churches* website will generally be listed on the first page of Google results.

6. About Us

The Pioneer Churches on the Prairies project is being undertaken by Steppingstones Partnership Inc. Steppingstones was established in 1989 by Russell Sawchuk as business and Internet consulting company. Over the last 35 years, the Company has been involved in a wide range of projects with private, government and non-profit organizations.



The *Pioneer Churches on the Prairies* is an ongoing project to record, document and display the historic churches established by early settlers in northeastern Alberta. The first immigrants arrived in the late 1890's and continued to settle for decades afterwards. Due to declining rural populations, fewer members, and increasing operational and maintenance costs, many of these parishes are closing. Time is running out to capture and preserve the memories of these beautiful historic churches for future generations.



We have just updated our *Pioneer Churches* website with the drone photographs we took in 2023. Fifteen (15) more churches were added. So now we have photos and histories on 92 different churches and their cemeteries. Our photo galleries now consist of over 3,000 high-quality, downloadable images.

Using these photos, we have now created 85 videos of the churches. Each video has the appropriate sacred hymns as a musical background. In 2024, we plan to continue to use our drones and cameras to record additional churches, post the images in the galleries, and create additional videos.

We have added a few new articles to our website (Resources -> Articles) about enhancing the security at remote churches / historical sites, and how to create a disaster preparedness plan. [Alberta religious organizations are eligible to apply for up to \$35,000 funding to enhance the security of their church building and grounds. For more information see Alberta Security Infrastructure Program (ASIP)].

New hymns were identified and digitized to provide the background music for the new videos. You can see (and listen) to them in (Resources -> Credits). Several new digitized albums have also added to our Music Library.

As a result of having accumulated a large number of large canvas-prints of these churches, we have been having photo exhibits at various parishes. If you would like to have a *Pioneer Churches* exhibit and presentation during a special event (e.g., Saint's Day, anniversary) at your parish, please email or phone me.

Please check out our updated website and enjoy the videos, photos and music! Also make your parishioners, family, friends and neighbors aware of the *Pioneer Churches* website so that they can enjoy it as well.
